Community Centre costs

Our community centre is an amazing asset, and we are unusual in Hobart in having one in community hands. But with the benefits of having this excellent building close to home, there come some onerous obligations as well. We have to work hard every year just to cover the basic running costs, which have increased enormously in the last decade. The fixed costs are:

Insurance	\$2410
Rates	\$300
Audit	\$170
Subtotal	\$2880

Following are the variable costs which include some fixed components eg use of gas cylinders.

Utilities	\$1000
Maintenance	\$500
Subtotal	\$1500
Grand Total for the Hall	\$4380

This means that we need to earn nearly **\$90** a week just to cover costs. So having the support of the Fern Tree community is vital if we want to keep this asset, and one of the things that means is making maximum use of our asset. This brings me to my next point:

What would you like to see happening in Fern Tree? What do the people of Fern Tree want from their community association?

We are unusual in Hobart; not only does the community association own the community centre, but we are all members of the Fern Tree Community Association (FTCA) just by living here. We pay no membership fee to join, all we have to do is move into the area.

Our boundaries are the Hobart City boundary at Neika and Summerleas Rd, and the upper part of Strickland Avenue, which includes about 400 households.

Each year a very small AGM audience elects an executive committee, which tries to engage the community in events both to raise money for the community centre and just because we want to make the Fern Tree community strong and vibrant.

Roaming animals

There have been some incidents recently where animals that should have been secured on their owner's property were able to wander on the road, causing a nuisance. A sheep knocked a cyclist off his bike on Huon Rd, causing serious damage to the bike, as well as shock and pain to the rider. Dogs have also threatened passers-by on roads. It's not just people who suffer, whether frightened by dogs or injured by sheep or in a more serious road accident. The animals too are in danger from vehicles. Protecting their welfare is important, and letting them roam isn't doing this. Please secure them safely. If you are threatened by dogs you can complain to the Hobart City Council. They will respond swiftly and serve a complaint on the owners, who must keep their dogs on their property by law.
