Explanatory notes:

Names on the roll, are those resident in Fern Tree, Neika or Ridgeway, when they volunteered or were called up for service. Ex-servicemen, who later became residents, are not included.

† with the name in **bold** identifies a Fern Tree etc. resident who did not return and was listed as either DoD, DoW or KiA.

Promotions gained by a soldier etc., during the course of service, their highest military rank achieved appears next to the “fate” column.

Badges at the Head of the Roll identify the primary parts of Australia’s defence forces during the two conflicts, in which those on the roll served.

On the left is the cap, hat and collar badge of the AIF [Australian Imperial Force]. This version was in worn by all Australian army units from 1904 until 1949.

On the right is the cap badge of the Royal Australian Air Force, worn from 1921 until 1953. Its forerunner, the AFC [Australian Flying Corps], was part of the AIF during *The Great War*.

Imperial Decorations were awarded to all military personnel, to recognise their service during both conflicts. They would have at least included the following medals:

The Great War

World War 2

British War Medal

British Victory Medal

Australia Service Medal 1939-1945

“Soldiers Avenue” on Queens Domain, was created in 1918/19 in remembrance of Hobart City resident citizens who did not survive *The Great War*. To form the “avenue”, 520 mainly Himalayan Cedar trees, were planted in their honour. From 2002 onwards, each soldier was also identified with a numbered cast bronze memorial plaque. Here are the plaques for our fallen:



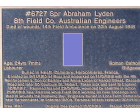

These 5 soldiers are part of the more than 62,000 Australian personnel, who died during *The Great War*.

Citizen Military Service in Australia.

From 1903 onwards, all Australia’s former Colonial military forces became the responsibility of the Commonwealth Government. From 1909, all able-bodied males, on reaching 18 years of age, were required to undergo peacetime militia training. During *The Great War*, serving overseas was voluntary for citizen soldiers. In *WW2*, all able-bodied single males over 18, were called-up to serve.

Our District’s Contribution

Research has revealed that collectively, the then small hamlets of Fern Tree, Neika and Ridgeway, made a creditable contribution to each war effort, as follows:

The Great War, from a total of just 59 households, 18 residents volunteered, 6 of whom died on Europe’s battlefields; and *World War 2*, from a total of 117 households, 37 residents either volunteered or were called up, 2 of whom died.

Our existing Community Centre in Stephenson Place, was built during 1967 as a kindergarten. This was to replace the original 1950 Westringa Road kindergarten, destroyed during the Tuesday 7 February 1967 bushfires. Each was designated as a **war memorial**. The aim was to create a community asset with an enduring practical use; see the two plaques on the western exterior wall.
